Adelaide furniture designer Justin Hermes is behind the design of these wooden pendants, which are made from reclaimed Oregon and salvaged oak. Hermes found beauty and inspiration in the pieces of timber left over when creating his bespoke work, and these took on a geometric form to give warmth to bare light bulbs. He designed the Georb Linear pendants after being commissioned to illuminate a public display of proposals for the Open Ideas Royal Adelaide Hospital site design competition.

(13) The Piggery Cafe

Chef and restaurateur Shannon Bennett, best known for his restaurant Vue de Monde, has launched a gastronomic village in Victoria's Dandenong Ranges. Burhnam Beeches will incorporate a bakery, cafe, microbrewery, market garden, steakhouse, trufferie, emu farm, artist-in-residence facilities, private villas and a boutique hotel. The Piggery Cafe and adjoining Burnham Bakery were the first to open as part of the project. The cafe, designed by Woods Bagot, features warm materials, exposed concrete walls and copper pipe detailing. Best Group managed the design and construction of the project's branding and wayfinding signage.
